#### LIVINGSTON FOOTBALL CLUB 1999-2000

#### Well ....., as the saying goes; 'You had to BE there!'

Sunday is normally a reasonably quiet day though there was not much quiet in evidence at Almondvale where four of Livingston's Youth Development squads turned the dressing room area's into a living of activity as coaches and players prepared to take part in the days scheduled fixtures.

It has taken a year - and a lot of hard work from the Youth Coaching staff - to bring

Livingston to a position where we can compete at almost every age-level in Scotland's senior league but, having pulled out all the stops, we are now secure in the knowledge that the essential foundations of Livingston's long-term future have finally been established.

Busying themselves in the final preparation of all manner of kit and equipment, a multitude of young, highly charged players milled around the dressing rooms in their senior sides replica strips. Their respective team coaches were just as enthusiastic - though they were perhaps suffering more from pre-match nerves than was apparent in the young charges they were trying to galvanise into appropriate age groups: for most, this day marked the beginning of the new leagues and their first taste of SFL Initiative competition.

Some say this frenetic activity is what football's all about, and I'd agree that it is a big part of the enjoyment. But if, in the long term, our coaches and scouts one day witness one of Livingston's protégés progress from the youth development system all the way to the first team - to then see him play to his expectations and get the home crowd on its feet to cheer his skills then that, I believe, is what it's really all about. And if we can complement that players achievements with the inclusion of several others - all of whom have learned their trade in Livingston's development system, then we will be doing our jobs and West Lothian will be all the richer for our endeayours.

The U16 team began their initiative league fixtures with a scheduled tie against Dunfermline at Fauldhouse. The younger Pars proved a very able and physical team; the long-ball game and tough tackling they produced during the first of three, half-hour periods certainly unsettled Livi's senior youth team and forced them to concede goals.

The second period saw a lifting of the Lions spirits and the lads began to dominate play without managing to get the ball in the net;

much credit to the Dunfermline goalkeeper who was in fine form. Livi continued to press throughout the final period until their persistence finally paid off: young David Ormiston was pulled down in the box with 5 mins. to go and Denis Haggart converted from the spot.

The Under 15's side were due to travel to Kilmarnock but unforeseen circumstances forced the Rugby Park authorities to postpone the fixture.

Coach Larry Haggart was well pleased with the tenacious


efforts of his Under 14 side; they met Celtic at Craigswood and performed brilliantly. I have already described the many organisational problems we all experienced during a close-season of dramatic expansion within the Youth Development programme but, despite all, Coach Larry Haggart and Asst. Alan Kane have made great progress in establishing a very settled side so early in the league season.

The skills of our junior Initiative side shone brightly on Sunday - even if they played much of their game against Dundee Utd. in a downpour. Coach John McLaughlan's U13 side showed some amazing skills in a closely contested game which proved an advert for the technical side of the game: the SFL appointed referee was pleased to enjoy a free-flowing match and did little more than indicate the direction of throwins.

A measure of just how far we have progressed this season is amply illustrated by the fact that our youngest squad - a U12 team coached by Mickey Lynch and asst. Bobby Wilson - also played their first competitive match of the West Lothian League season and returned a convincing 8-0 win against a battling Queensferry Thistle side. It took our youngest Lions 15 minutes to find a way past an agile Queensferry 'keeper but first scorer Andrew McQuillan went on to notch up another three strikes before full-time. He was joined on the score-sheet by youngsters Alan Urquart, Sean Jones and Barry Canning though full-back Gordon Wilson was applauded for sinking the 'goal of the game' from 25 yards in 59 minutes.

#### Lam Westwater (Goalkeeper)

A regular in the Pars team which moved from the Second to the Premier Division in the 1980's, Westie moved temporarily to Falkirk then Dundee before returning to East End Park in 1994. Very fit and agile, many have tried over the years but failed to remove him as first choice keeper. Unfortunately, suffered a serious ligament injury in his first outing of 1998.99 and thanks to Lee Butler's superb form was unable to regain his place.



#### Andrew Tod (Central Defender)

Surprisingly late into the professional ranks when he signed from Kelty Hearts in 1993, he has now make of 200 League and Cup appearances. He is dangerous at set pieces, has a keen eye for goal, and has

improved his defensive skills considerably. Injuries last season meant for the first time since arriving at the club he did not play in virtually every game.

Craig Ireland (Central Defender)

Centre half who was signed form Aberdeen for a fee of £70.000 in February 1996. Craig's time with Dunfermline has been up and down but there have been periods of very good form when he has shown just what he is capable of doing. Occasionally used as a long throw expert, Craig is a strong tackling defender who is dangerous at set pieces in the opposition penalty area.

#### Jamie Squires (Central Defender)

Signed on loan from Preston North End in March 1998. Jamie signed longer term for the Pars although he is currently on the open to transfer list. A big very solid defender, Jamie got his chance at the end of the season when Craig Robertson was injured and performed very well against Celtic. Was recommended to Dunfermline by former Pars player and Preston boss Dave Moyes. Another one who tried to establish himself in a young Pars defence, Jamie scored twice last season. A good long passer.

Scott Thomson (Full Back/Midfield)

Signed on a three year deal under freedom of contract from Raith Rovers during last summer, Scott can play in a variety of positions including full back, midfield or forward on either side of the park. Has a deceptive turn of pace and a very good eye for goal which, with a bit of luck, might have seen him score more often last season. Another who could do with a full, uninterrupted season.

#### Jason Dair (Full Back/Midfield)

One of Dick Campbell's first signings, Jason was signed from Raith Rovers for £20,000 last season. As a youngster in Jimmy Nicholl's successful Raith team of the early 90's, Jason was very highly thought of. He was part of a £1 million transfer to Millwall with Steve Crawford but returned to Raith with his old boss in 1997. His second spell there was not as good but at 25 he is just coming into his prime as a footballer.

Jamie Dolan (Midfield)

Dunfermline Athletic Career: 9 appearances, 0 goals. Another of Dick Campbell's first signings, Jamie was brought to East End Park from Dundee United in February. A wholehearted and strong tackling midfielder. Jamie is also very skilful at the centre of

midfield. Spend ten years at Motherwell before moving to Tannadice.

#### Chris Templemann (Midfield)

A product of the Dunfermline youth policy, Chris broke through in dramatic fashion last season with a Man of the Match winning performance against Dundee on his debut. Tall and gangly, Chris is very skilful for his size. He shows great maturity and coolness, and can tackle well too. Has played for Scotland Under 18" and is a great prospect for the future.

#### Chris McGroaty (Midfield)

Another product of the Pars youth policy, Chris is a real crowd pleaser who operates a traditional role on the left wing. Willing to take on the opposition and has the ability to fire in acurate crosses, Chris will be trying to get a regular first team place this season.

Hamish French (Midfield/Forward)

Signed from Dundee United for a fee of £150,000 in October 1991, Hamish is now Dunfermline's second-longest serving player. Originally with Highland League side Keith, Hamish was a late entrant into the professional game when he joined Dundee United in 1987. Always honest and hard working, Hamish is Pars current top goalscorer with 61 goals with Dunfermline. Missed much of last season through injury but has recently negotiated a new one-year contract.

#### Stewart Petrie (Forward)

Signed from Forfar Athletic, and another who was top scorer at Station Park before his £70,000 move in August 1993. Stewart started with junior club Dundee East Craigs before spending five seasons at Forfar. He can play either through the middle, or play in wide left berth from where he can fire in telling crosses. His wide role seems to suit Pars present set-up and his driving runs always have the potential to cause havoc. Was Pars top goalscorer for two seasons, but plays the provider role now. Yet to agree a new contract.

#### Andy Smith (Forward)

Considered by many to be one of Bert Paton's best buys, Andy was snapped up from Airdrie in July 1995. Although he suffered a broken leg in his first match, he returned to the side to play a crucial role in promotion, scoring 10 goals in 19 starts. In 1996/97, Andy was almost ever-present playing from midfield then in 1997/98 he lead the line with stunning effect, scoring 26 goals. Despite being made captain at the start of the season 1998/1999, was not Andy's best season with the club. A real lionheart, Andy's aerial power makes him feared by many defenders and won him a cull p to the Scotland 'B' team.

#### Owen Coyle (Forward)

The third of Dick Campbell's mid-season signings, many were surprised when Owen decided to opt for Dunfermline ahead of other offers he might have had. His first few months with Dunfermline did not bring the success hoped for, but Coyle is a skilful and talented player who will be a tremendous asset to the Pars in the First Division. Previously with Dumbarton, Clydebank, Airdrie, Dundee United and Bolton Wanderers in England and a former Republic of Ireland internationalist.

#### Gullit fires the Bullet

Magpies boss, Ruud Gullit quit St. James' Park on the morning of 28th August - the day Livi left the Lions Den to face Morton at Cappielow - reports on his movements thereafter strongly suggest that he did not manage to take-in the game.

The announcement followed hard on the heels of a disappointing string of results which had helped fuel increasing media speculation that he might be about to quit the post he had held for almost exactly a year. Newcastle - whose team-roster sports a number of top athletes such as Shearer, D. Ferguson, Ketsbaia and Dyer (none of which Ray Stewart has ever been reported as showing the slightest interest in) - had a comfortable start to the season; they toured Holland - the gaffer's former home - as part of their pre-season build-up and recorded good results against Den Bosch (W2-1), SV Deurne (W4-0) and Helmondspoort (W2-1). Things were apparently ticking along nicely until they entered the Den!

It's fair to say that, on the evening, the Lions did a great job of clipping the Magpies wings and thereafter made a meal of them; 24th and 47th minute goals gave Livi full advantage and, despite Keiron Dyer managing to record his first goal in a Newcastle shirt, Livi kept the lead to the whistle. Speaking after the game, Ruud Gullit was quoted as saying, ".... we all learned something, certainly I did." The word 'all' we can only speculate makes reference to those British Club managers who have yet to anticipate a visit to West Lothian, though it can perhaps be narrowed down to Scottish

first division managers in particular.

One of the problems associated with having a large squad of players is certainly that of ensuring that they all remain match-fit. It's a problem Ray Stewart is only too well aware of - though he'd be the first to admit he'd rather have the headache of too many players - as opposed to the nightmare of having too few. Players have to play - no amount of small-side practice and training routines can compensate for the real thing and, with only three players allowed to inhabit the dug-out, it's always a struggle to keep fringe players motivated - especially when they have little option but to watch the game from the stand. Livingston have compensated by sanctioning a number of loan deals; Neil Bennett and Sean Clark have joined Montrose while Ian

Little has renewed his partnership with Alloa boss, Terry Christie.

Of the younger lads - having moved up from last year's senior youth side - Darren Baillie, Grant Laing and Chris Pickering have all joined Junior side West Calder, now managed by former Livingston United veteran Mike Lynch.

Ray has also organised a number of friendlies, to which he has invited the participation of several of Tony Taylor's current U16 squad. Match Day programme contributor Henry Rintoul, followed the Lions on their latest outing - to Pennypit Park at Prestonpans, where Livingston met Preston Athletic for an evening kick-off on Wednesday 25th August.


The game remained goalless until Craig Feroz buried a superb through-ball from Alan Sharp in the 78th minute - deserved compensation for having two previous strikes disallowed for off-side.

Craig Feroz and Brydon Fairgrieve came off shortly after to allow the last remaining subs to show what they were capable of; it proved a fortuitous substitution when Adam Moffat slung in a precision free-kick which found Denis Haggart in the danger area - he made no mistake in calculating the angles before glancing a header beyond the Preston 'keeper.

#### LIVINGSTON FOOTBALL CLUB 1999-2000

Despite the fact that Livingston FC is enjoying only it's fifth competitive season in West Lothian, you would have to dig deep among the Club's collected memorabilia to find any reference to Meadowbank Thistle who, coincidentally, would - had they remained at Edinburgh's Commonwealth Stadium - be celebrating their silver anniversary this month.

All those players who made the short geographic migration from Mid to West Lothian at the outset of season 95.96 have now moved on and even the badge which had identified Livi as having descended from the 'Wee Bankies' has been transformed.

But there are those who still remember. Scott Brown can count 21 consecutive seasons of involvement with the Club he first served as a ten year old ball-boy back in 78'. "It was the first game I went to. Clyde were the visitors and we lost 2-1", he recalls. "Not long after, I joined the supporters Club and travelled regularly to the away games. I also joined the supporters team and played in over 100 games as a defensive midfielder. I was employed as a steward on match days and, within a few years, went on to become chief steward. I thought it was all over when the Club made the move to West Lothian, but I was pleased to receive a letter from the Directors asking me to continue in the role."

Scott - as famous for his courteous manner as he is infamous for his encyclopaedic, first-hand knowledge of the Club - is one of the first

members of staff which any visitor taking corporate hospitality at Almondvale will meet.

He admits that, once people learn how long he has been involved with the Club, as sure as not their first question is always, 'What do you think of the changes?' So, not wanting to break the tradition, I asked him the same question.

"I think the move to Livingston has been tremendous. There was so much controversy over the dropping of the Meadowbank name - but that's the price of progress. How many people were opposed to the changes which bankruptcy forced on Newton Heath - I bet a number of them didn't fancy being called 'Manchester United'.

"The biggest difference has to be the fact that we are now playing in a purpose-built Football - rather than Athletics - stadium. I would say we now have a real, hard-core following of around 2,500 here at Almondvale, as opposed to perhaps 70 or so at Meadowbank. And look at the potential. We are competing in the players' market and bucking the trend of the majority of Scottish Club's by attracting new support and big name players. Livingston is not just surviving - it's going forward and the momentum is still building.

"The Meadowbank era has not been eradicated; it's an integral and ever-present part of the Club's history - just as Newton Heath was to Man-U. Club's need to have energy and ambition if they have any real hope of progressing. You have to keep looking forward. There's a great buzz around this Club again and I'm determined to stay and see it go all the way."




